## IGNITING THE SPARK FOR THE FUTURE

“What do you want to be when you grow up?” This is a question young people are asked all the time. To help students think about and prepare for their future careers, Indiana University Health joined Junior Achievement of Central Indiana and a myriad of business, education, government, nonprofit and community leaders to provide a two-day hands-on career exposition for over 7,000 eighth-grade students. During JA JobSpark, students were exposed to jobs in eight career clusters, including Health & Life Sciences.

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JA JobSpark combines classroom learning with a hands-on career exposition. A coalition of educators and industry leaders, led by Junior Achievement of Central Indiana, developed the program, which is massive, both in terms of square feet and impact. JA JobSpark is a part of Junior Achievement’s career-readiness curriculum, which has been delivered to many of the students throughout their academic experience, beginning in elementary school. The curriculum and the JA JobSpark career expo are meant to “spark” an interest in students and get them excited for their futures.

IU Health team members spent several months and hundreds of planning hours to create a real-life operating room, an X-ray clinic, and physical and occupational therapy areas. IU Health emergency medical team members taught hands-on CPR. More than 1,300 IU Health team members

volunteered their time over two days to greet the students and teachers, guide them through the experiences, and hand out healthy snacks.

Our message was that no matter which career a student plans to pursue, staying active and healthy is important to a student’s future career and life. Before stepping into the operating room, students were provided with face masks and hairnets. Team members showed students how to use operating room equipment, and students practiced procedures on a mannequin. They were taught how to read X-ray films and were asked to identify body areas related to the X-ray. Students enjoyed touring an IU Health Lifeline ambulance and being able to touch buttons and flip switches. Students were encouraged to ask questions about what classes they should take and what skills are necessary for certain careers.

Now, when students who attended JA JobSpark are asked, “What do you want to be when you grow up?” they have an answer, know the path to take, and have a plan to get there.
