On a warm September Friday in 2016, anyone passing by Montpelier Elementary School in Blackford County would have seen a curious sight - nearly 30 sixth-grade students swarming across the school's playground. By itself, not unusual, but on this particular day the students were working alongside

team members from Indiana University Health Blackford Hospital. Our nurses, educators, X-ray techs, respiratory therapists and other staff members had traded in their stethoscopes and uniforms for shovels and wheelbarrows as part of a daylong effort to improve playground facilities at the school.

Seeing these enthusiastic students teamed up with our team members gave me pause to reflect on how important it is for our organization to be working in partnership with our patients and the broader community.

Designated as a Critical Access Hospital by Medicare, IU Health Blackford Hospital is committed to delivering the highest quality care to the residents of Blackford County and the surrounding area. We continually promote wellness initiatives, such as diabetes education and tobacco cessation, for the benefit of our patients and their family members.

I believe it is also important for us to look beyond the hospital setting and to be a leader in the important work of promoting healthy lifestyles for all. One way we are able to do this is through our annual health fair, which includes free and low cost screenings and brings together multiple community partners to offer education and outreach activities.

In 2016, we helped launch the Healthy Community Alliance of Delaware and Blackford Counties by encouraging local businesses and organizations to join this effort aimed at encouraging improved eating habits, increased physical activity and tobacco cessation.

We have also partnered with other area organizations to bring interested families to the Growers and Makers Market in downtown Hartford City to learn about the importance of fresh produce in a family meal plan. In addition, our partnership with the YMCA called Active Afterschool connects experts with elementary schoolchildren in Blackford County to teach the importance of exercise, physical activity and eating right.

Investing in our community and creating health-oriented partnerships are critically necessary to change our culture and improve the overall health of our population in the long run. I am pleased to share this summary of the impact IU Health Blackford Hospital has made in the local community in 2016.
