



## GIFTS OF GRACE PROVIDES OPPORTUNITIES TO INDIANA RESIDENTS

Gifts of Grace is Indiana University Community Health Positive Link's annual holiday gift giving drive that links community member donations to individuals living with HIV/AIDS and their affected family members in Bloomington, Terre Haute and surrounding counties. Positive Link provides social services for those living with HIV including linkage to medical care, social support, medication access assistance and adherence tools, food and nutrition needs, housing and utility assistance, advocacy, mental health and substance use counseling and referrals.

In 2016, Gifts of Grace celebrated its 15th year.

## GIFTS OF GRACE RECIPIENT

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Gifts of Grace donations vary in cost. Positive Link clients and their children/families complete a “wish list,” which we anonymously code and provide to



donors. Client “wishes” can vary from gift cards to gas and/or food and nutrition needs to clothes, coats, books, shoes, housing items, entertainment gift cards and much more. Eighty percent of our clients (and their affected families) live at or below Indiana’s poverty level. Many of their “wishes” are actual necessities. Our hope is to be able to allow people to receive not just necessities, but also a gift or gifts that they might not ordinarily be able to afford.

In addition to a gift or gifts, for the last four years Positive Link has coordinated food drives with local organizations in order to provide each household with a food/daily living gift basket (food, toiletries, cleaning supplies, paper goods). This requires several food/personal items drives and has proved to be incredibly helpful and an exciting holiday extra for clients and their families.
