The Implementation Strategy process is meant to align Indiana University Health and its hospitals' initiatives and programs with goals, objectives and indicators that address significant community health needs described in the CHNA.

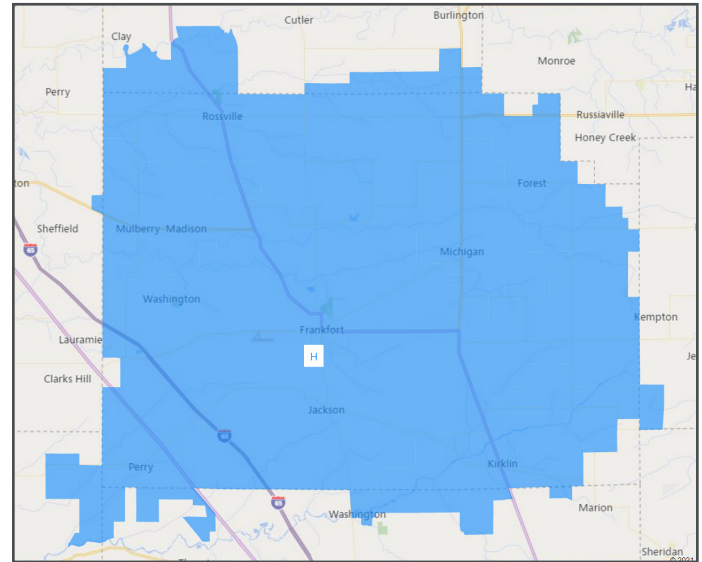
About the Hospital

Indiana University Health Frankfort is a critical access hospital in Frankfort, Indiana, serving the residents of Clinton County by providing a full range of healthcare services including emergency medicine, surgery, cardiovascular care, respiratory care and a sleep lab. IU Health Frankfort is a Pathway to Excellence designated facility

The hospital is part of Indiana University Health (IU Health), the largest and most comprehensive health system in the state of Indiana. IU Health, in partnership with Indiana University School of Medicine, one of the nation's leading medical schools, gives patients access to leading-edge medicine and treatment options that are available first, and often only, at IU Health. Community Definition

IU Health Frankfort's community is defined as Clinton County, Indiana. The county accounted for 96 percent of the hospital's inpatient cases in 2019. The estimated population of this community in 2019 was 32,250. The following map portrays this community.



Development of Implementation Strategy

This Implementation Strategy was developed through conversations with key hospital leaders and community stakeholders within the West Central Region (WCR) of IU Health. The WCR includes the hospitals IU Health Arnett, Frankfort and White Memorial. Hospital team members included leaders and clinicians representing multiple areas of expertise, including administration, nursing, behavioral health, maternal and infant health, pediatrics, diversity and inclusion, human resources, population health and community outreach.

Each year, senior leadership at IU Health Frankfort will review this Implementation Strategy to determine if changes should be made to better address the health needs of the community.

Community Health Needs Identified

The 2022 – 2024 Implementation Strategy was developed by IU Health Frankfort in response to the prioritized, community health needs identified in the 2021 CHNA. The CHNA process was informed by multiple data sources gathered in January through June of 2021. Demographic, health condition, health behavior and social determinants of health data; findings from other community health assessments of the hospital's local community; and input from community members and organizations were analyzed and reviewed to assess the health of the community. Health disparities were highlighted across the different data sources too.

Significant community health needs in the 2021 CHNA are listed below, in alphabetical order. Those highlighted will be addressed in calendar years 2022 through 2024.
