2024 Grant Opportunity

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Community Impact Investment Fund (CIIF)

- \$200M in funds dedicated by IU Health and managed by the IU Health Foundation to support a Community Impact Investment Fund (CIIF) to address social determinants of health affecting our marginalized and minoritized communities
 - Funds support grants available to each IU Health region
 - Project requests between \$250,000 and \$1,000,000 and over a term up to three years
 - Applications accepted once each year
 - An IU Health team member must serve as a collaborator for those invited to submit a full application
 - Funds can be used towards programmatic costs as well as capital project requests

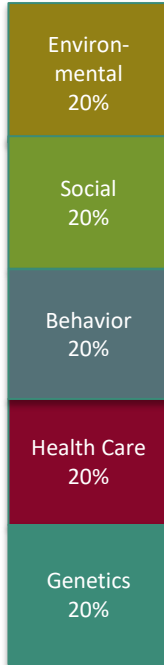
New for 2024

- Each region will have a specific pillar focus area
- Max award is being changed from \$2M over three years to \$1M over three years
- We expect to award a total of \$6M in grants for 2024

- Programs that support adult education and training



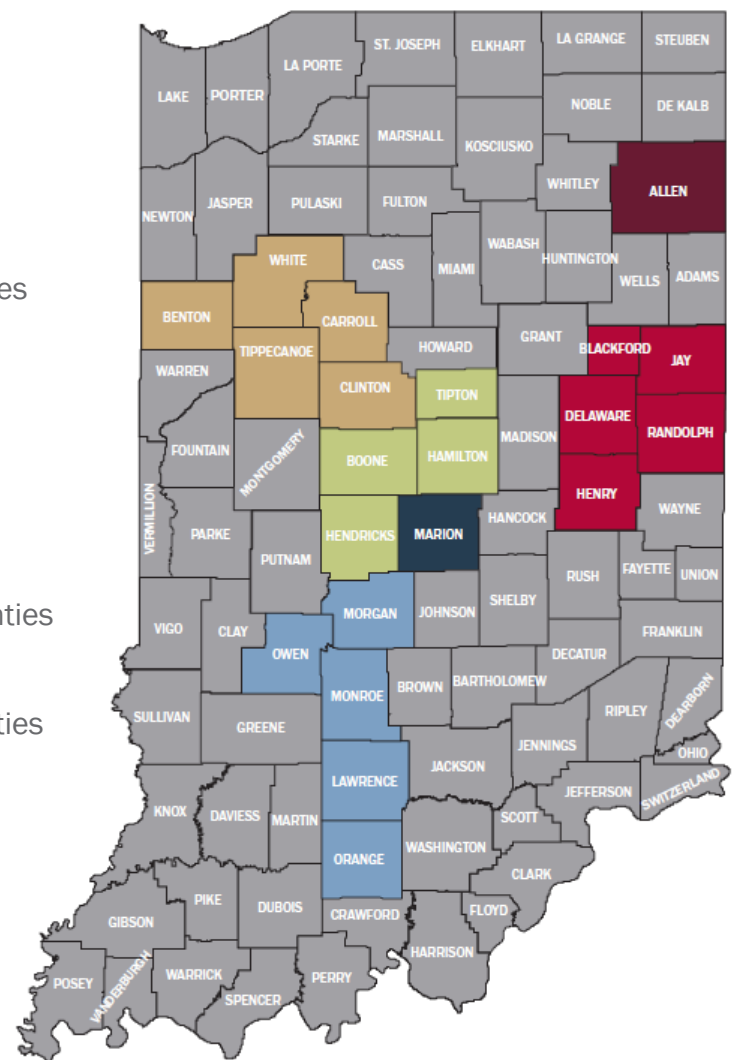
Educational Attainment

Letter of Interest



- Be concise and to the point
- Ideas and collaborations do not have to be fully developed in order to be considered, but should be if invited to apply
- Projects should address a root cause, not the symptom, of the social determinant of health being solved
- Main program should not be focused on funding clinical healthcare services
- IU Health team member engagement *not* required to submit an LOI, but is required for those invited to submit a full application
